The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Warren met in Regular Session in its offices in the Wayne Dumont, Jr. Administration Building, Belvidere, New Jersey on April 9, 2025 at 6:00 p.m.

REPORTS AND COMMENTS

County Counsel Joe Bell had items for Executive Session. Issues concerning certain defenses of claims that had been against the county, also acquisition of properties in Harmony and Lopatcong Townships.

Director of Engineering Mike Finelli had a few items for this evening; first item was County Route #659, Spring Valley Road, Hardwick Township, expect to have the wall complete by the end of the week. Next, will install amphibian fence and then pave, anticipate project to complete by the end of the month.

Mr. Finelli provided an update on the 2022 Resurfacing project. Preconstruction meeting has taken place, tree trimming and drainage work will be done on County Route #519, then paving will take place. He continued with an update on the 2023 Resurfacing project, his office will be responding to the NJ Department of Transportation comments. Goal is to get the project out to bid, with potential start of project in the fall.

County Planner Dave Dech reported on the 2024 recycling numbers released by NJ Department of Environmental Protection. Warren County is ranked fourth in the state for traditional recycling items, such as cans and bottles and ranked sixth in the state for total solid waste.

Mr. Dech also announced updated trail maps for eight (8) sites have been completed and will appear on the website, under the Land Preservation page. He added, soon the maps will be available for downloading as well.

Mr. Sarnoski asked if there has any feedback regarding the 80/46 Interchange from NJ DOT. Mr. Dech stated, per DOT still under review at this time.

County CFO Kim Francisco reported this evening the budget has been wrapped up and the auditors are reviewing 2024.

County Administrator Alex Lazorisak only had the vacancy report this evening, backfill of positions.

County Public Works Director Emily Hammer provided an update on July 2023 storm damage to Lommason Glen Road. Construction activities will begin this coming week. This work consists of drainage, retaining wall and embankment stabilization, along with reconstruction of the entire road. Some drainage under the road will be included, which is part of the mitigation factor against future issues. Mr. Sarnoski apologized for skipping over Ms. Hammer.

COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Mr. Kern thanked Mr. Tierney and his team for the work in preserving approximate 450 acres in Knowlton and Frelinghuysen Townships, with cost of the county’s share at approximately \$100,000.00. This acquisition already borders previously preserved land.

Secondly, Mr. Kern stated a draft resolution from Tara Mezzanotte will be circulated by Mr. Infinito in respect to the Paulins Kill for review.

Next, he discussed conversation he had with Mr. Allen, Councilman of Belvidere, regarding a handicap parking spot on Greenwich/Market Street, County Route #620, near the pharmacy. The current structure is the handicap parking is across the street. Mr. Kern requested if there is something the county can do to get this parking on the side of the pharmacy, he request that we get something in front of this Board for review and approval.

Lastly, Mr. Kern reported a longtime volunteer William “Bill” Hahn passed away. Mr. Hahn has served on various boards (Planning Board and Board of Recreation) and he did a lot of work with our parks. He will be missed.

Ms. Ciesla had several items to report on this evening. First, she thanked Mr. Kern for attending the LEAD event.

Second item, she reported on was the Health and Wellness Field Event held on April 4 at the County Vo-Tech School. Well attended and an amazing event. She thanked all who participated and helped.

Next, Ms. Ciesla spoke about the Bicentennial Event coming up on Saturday, June 28 with a rain date of Sunday, June 29. Flyers and more information will be forth coming. She encouraged everyone to come and take part.

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She spoke of the upcoming Small Business Week networking event to be held at Little Ridge Winery on May 6, hosted by the Warren County Economic Development Committee.

Lastly, she reported on attending RevNJ meeting in Union County. The State of NJ is preparing to celebrate America's 250th. The celebration theme is the Crossroads of the Revolution. She encouraged the municipalities to get involved.

Mr. Sarnoski only had one item for this evening. He attended the Veterans Resource and Job Expo on April 4 at the Belvidere Manor. He thanked Jackie Petersen our Veterans Resource Officer and everyone that was a part of the event. Nothing but good comments received. Mr. Sarnoski would like to see this event continue each year.

CLOSING PUBLIC COMMENTS

Tara Mezzanotte, I80/Route 611 Municipal Liaison, came before the Board to provide an update regarding the EXPLORE Act, the Pennsylvania counties and municipalities appreciate the initiative that Warren County has taken on passing the resolution. She discussed the safety concerns that is had with the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area and how the concerns are similar in Northampton and Monroe counties and the municipalities as well.

Yanis Lypins, resident of Franklin Township, came before the Board to discuss the teaching of logic in our schools.

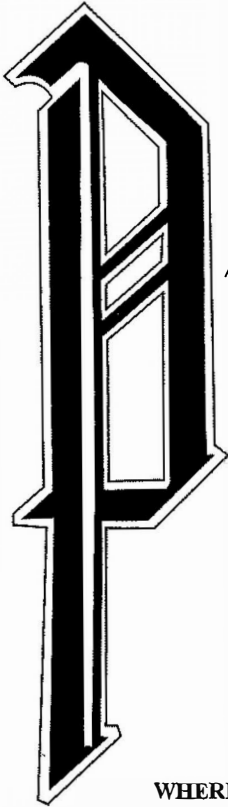

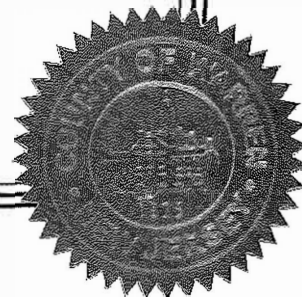
WHEREAS, according to the New Jersey Child Support Council, "This agency has set a high standard for excellence in public service and work commitment".

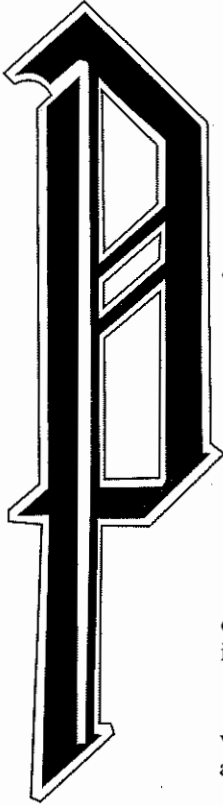

WHEREAS, with leadership and commitment, we can make a difference in preventing sexual violence in our community by increasing education, awareness, and community involvement; and

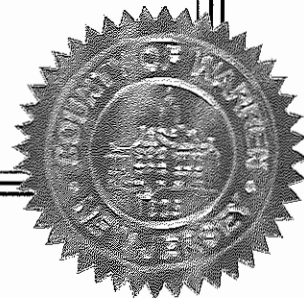
